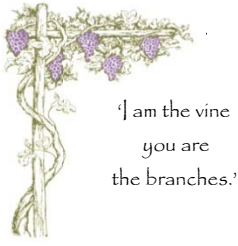

# Costa Rica Update

Hello to all my friends and family of Concord,

Where to begin? First of all, it is hard to believe that it has been almost three months that I have been back here in Costa Rica, so let's start from back in PA. I was so happy that I was able to share with all of you a little bit of what happened in Costa Rica in my first 6 months at the *Costa Rica: Mission and Music* in January. It was such a blessing to see so many people I love and miss and to get to share (and I hope encourage) you all with what God has been doing down here. Thank you for coming to support and encourage me and for the additional financial support for my goals and mission in Costa Rica.

Second, we had a great couple of weeks with the team from Costa Rica in January. God moved in powerful ways to in both the adult and youth retreats. We saw lives changed by the power of God's Word and His promises. I know many of you were very blessed by these retreats, but we were also blessed to have the privilege to serve you all. You are still in the hearts of those who came from Costa Rica to serve you, and I trust that "He who began a good work in you will carry it out to completion until the day of Jesus Christ" (Philippians 1:6).

Further, God has again proven His faithfulness in our obedience. Despite all the things happening in Costa Rica in January (losing the building for the ministry down here), the team was obedient to God's calling to do the retreats in PA. A few weeks after returning to Costa Rica, God blessed the obedience with a beautiful new home for the ministry. It may not be the final location for the ministry long term but it is a great facility that will allow the ministry to continue to grow until God provides His perfect final place for this ministry.

There are many more stories to tell, but I will try to give a quick overview of the rest. When I got back down here in February, we welcomed three new missionary teachers to the team, moved into our new location, started class for Glory Christian School, and hosted a mission team in the first 3 weeks. Needless to say it was a little bit crazy. We were also blessed to have my brother Brandon and Rich Albanese join us down here for a week in March. Now I am getting settled into my schedule of teaching five science classes and getting ready for mission teams coming down starting in June.

To finish, the last two months have been the most challenging for me since I have been down here for a number of reasons, but through the trials, God is teaching me many things. I am claiming James 1:2-4, trusting that the trials test my faith and produce perseverance which works to make me mature and complete in Him.

Thanks for all the prayers and support! You all are a blessing to me.

### Just a few of the issues that will be brought before the General Conf are:

**Clergy Appointments** - A proposal would change the *Book of Discipline* from saying that ordained elders in good standing 'shall' be continued in appointments to saying 'may' be. Another ministry related proposal would streamline ordination, allowing candidates to be eligible for appointment as soon as they finish educational requirements

**Homosexuality** - This General Conference will see a range of petitions seeking to change where the church stands on homosexuality and unofficial caucuses will be active on opposing sides.

**'Set-aside' - Bishop** - Currently the president of the Council of Bishops serves two years while continuing to oversee a geographical area also. The bishops changing the church's constitution to give the office of president a 4 year term free of conference or area overseeing. The set-aside bishop would serve as president of the Council of Bishops and as the denomination's chief ecumenical officer.

**Budget** - The shrinking of the UMC in the US has reduced giving along with the recession. GCFA and the Connectional Table have put forward a \$603 million general church budget for 2013-2016 which will be about a 6% drop from the previous four years.
